Papers offering innovative research contributions in any aspect of Security and Control of Identity in Society are solicited for submission to this workshop of the 22<sup>nd</sup> *IFIP International Information Security Conference*. Papers may present theory, applications or practical experiences (e.g., case studies) on topics including, but not limited to:

Identity management  
Profiling and customer relation management  
Global management of identities  
Advanced identity documents

RFID and other, tracking technologies  
Biometrics  
Surveillance  
ID related crime  
IT law for preventing misuse  
Computer Forensics

Privacy, anonymity and pseudonymity

Adequacy and Inadequacy of the Law  
Social, legal and ethical aspects of IT security

### Instructions for paper submission

Submitted papers must not substantially overlap with papers that have been published or that are simultaneously submitted to a journal or a conference with proceedings. Papers must be written in English; they should be at most 6 pages in total, including bibliography and well-marked appendices. The paper should be intelligible without its appendices. Accepted papers will be presented at the conference and published in the SEC 2007 conference proceedings by the official IFIP publisher Springer Science and Business Media. At least one author of each accepted paper is required to register with the conference and present the paper.
